A FORGOTTEN HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN EUROPE?

Conference on the Humanitarian Situation in Ukraine and Ways Forward

The ongoing conflict in Ukraine continues to claim the lives of people and damage civilian infrastructure. After more than three years, over 10,000 have been killed, including almost 3,000 civilians, 1.6 million have been displaced, and 4.4 million have been directly affected by continued hostilities. With 4 million people in need of urgent assistance, with no forthcoming political solution in sight, and support to humanitarian aid waning, vulnerabilities—particularly of those living along both sides of the contact line and in non-government controlled areas—are increasing at a worrying pace.

Feelint that the situation increasingly risks becoming a crisis forgotten by a large section of the international community, with the support of the European Commission's Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection department (ECHO) and the German Foreign Office, ACCESS Consortium partners (Action contre la Faim, People in Need, Médecins du Monde and Agency for Technical Cooperation and Development with its REACH initiative) joined forces to organize an international conference to present the current humanitarian situation in Ukraine, and look at ways forward.

Through a two-panel discussion, the conference aims to shed light on the vulnerabilities of the conflict-affect population, encourage discussion among speakers and participants, and urge the main stakeholders in the conflict, in the negotiations and in the humanitraian action to take action leading to a sustainable and lasting solution to the conflict, and a tangible improvement of the humanitarian situation.
